- Different types of truth-value gaps in natural language (homogeneity, vagueness, presuppositions)
- Typology and universals in formal semantics, particularly in the semantics of conjunction and universal quantification
- Intensional semantics, particularly DP arguments of opaque predicates, intentional identity and distinctness
- Using experimental methods to detect semantic context-dependency
